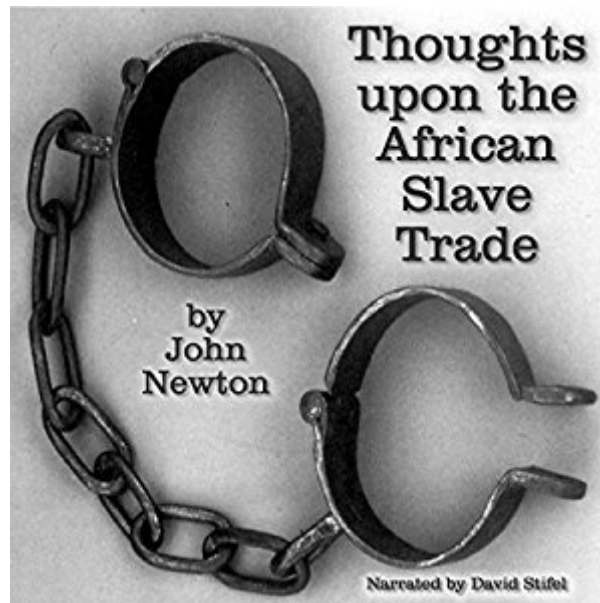

He is best known for writing Amazing Grace. I suspect if you are reading this you already know all that. They show a picture of the actual book. It has the very stylized print of the times. Unfortunately when they scanned the document the words are just about unreadable. It would be a relatively easy fix. If you could get it on some sort of editing program you could fix up about 95% of it. I think even I would be willing to give it a try.

It's a good book, but for research only, not for reading pleasure. It does give good insight, however, into the life of John Newton (author of Amazing Grace) and his part in the Atlantic Slave Trade.
